

LA POSTA VECCHIA, ITALY This ultimate airport hotel on the sea, 25 minutes from Rome, was built in the 2nd century B.C., rebuilt in the 17th century and remodeled by Paul Getty in 1960. It's still low-key in spite of the aristocratic proportions and Renaissance furnishings. *laposta vecchia.com*. S.F. CITY HALL When San Franciscans express themselves collectively, nothing is too patrician or glamorous. Designed by architect

Arthur Brown after Paris' dome of Les Invalides. SCHINKEL PALACES, POTSDAM, ITALY Never has "simplicity" been more magnificent: clean-line plaster exteriors with flat roofs, faux-painting rather than paneling and informal English gardens.







Bodie, Mono Lake, Manzanar, Bristlecone Pines, Mt. Whitney, Lone Pine. It's filled with a California history of cowboys-and-Indians, water rights, gold, Japanese internment. SPAIN Barcelona and Tarragona house jewels of the most admired architects (Coderch, Miralles, Gaudí, de la Sota). GUANAJUATO, MEXICO Built into the mountains, the city's roads and tunnels


